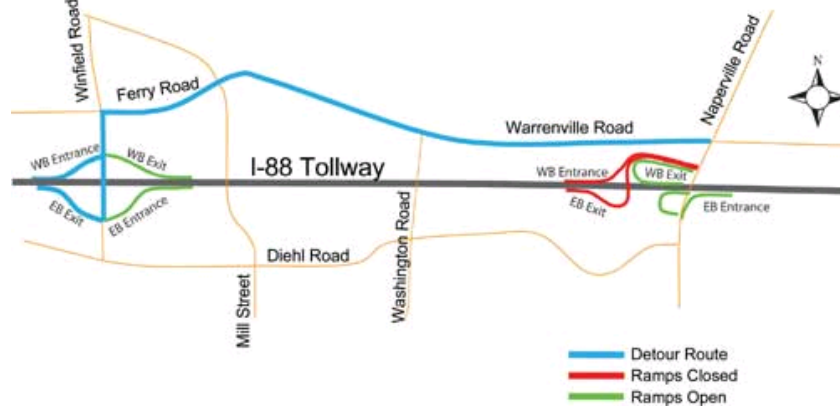

This project was part of the Illinois State Toll Highway Authority's (ISTHA), Open Roads for a Faster Future Long Range Plan, a ten-year capital program to rebuild the 274-mile tollway system, converting all existing mainline toll plazas to Open Road Tolling (ORT) plazas. This project required the resurfacing and adding a lane on the Ronald Regan Memorial Tollway, (I-88) between Mile Post 131.0 (Finley Road), and Mile Post 137.3 (Route 83), in DuPage County, Illinois.

David Mason & Associates provided surveying and civil engineering services. This consisted of topographic surveys and the generation of cross section and profile drawings. In order to maintain existing right-of-way the drainage design included the redesign of existing swales and the addition of weirs in order to provide retention of storm runoff from the additional roadway and plaza impervious areas.

DMA teamed with Edwards & Kelcey under a mentor-protégé agreement. This teaming arrangement not only provided DMA with experience in Tollway projects but also allowed for increased diversity goal credits for Edwards & Kelcey.
